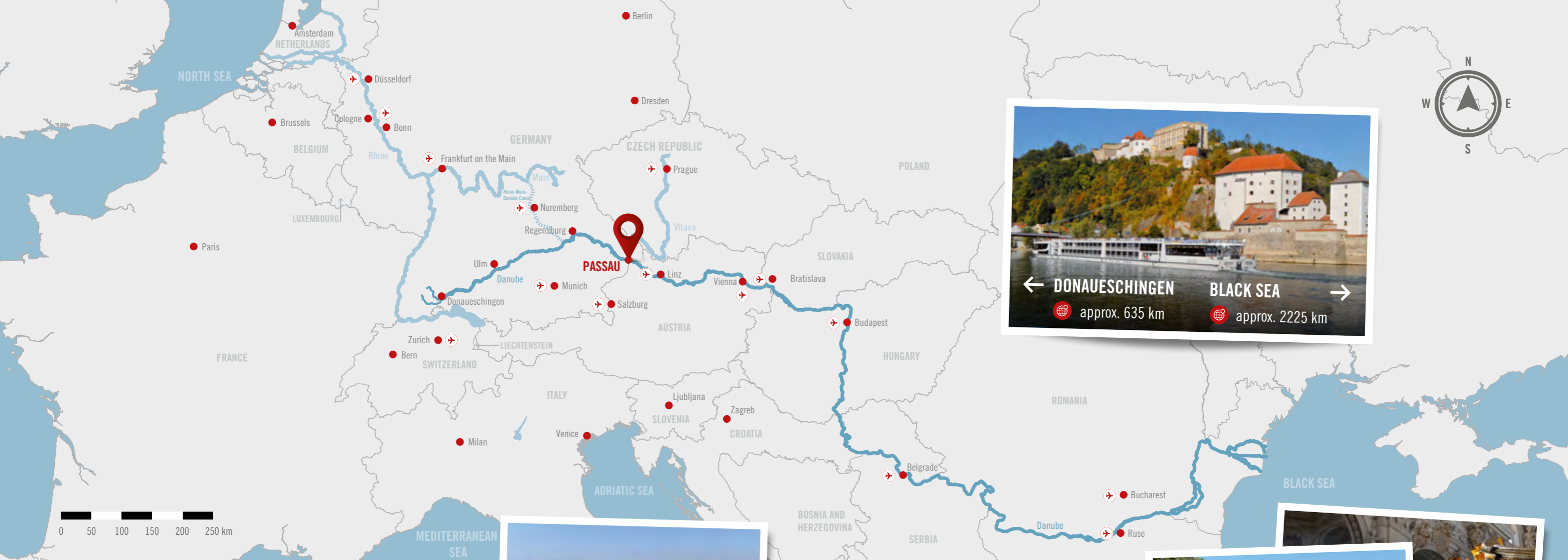

Passau is ideally located. The city is perfectly connected to both the highway network and the German railway service's high-speed ICE network. Munich and Linz (Austria) airports are also close by. As a result, plenty of interesting destinations in the region are quick and easy to reach. Popular trips include the Bavarian Forest, Bohemia in the Czech Republic, the "Bäderdreieck" spa towns to the west as well as the picturesque Innviertel and Mühlviertel regions in Upper Austria.

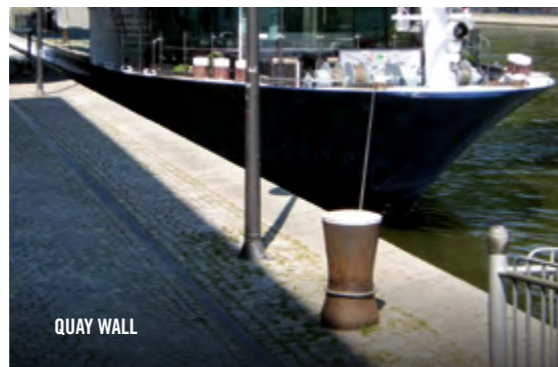

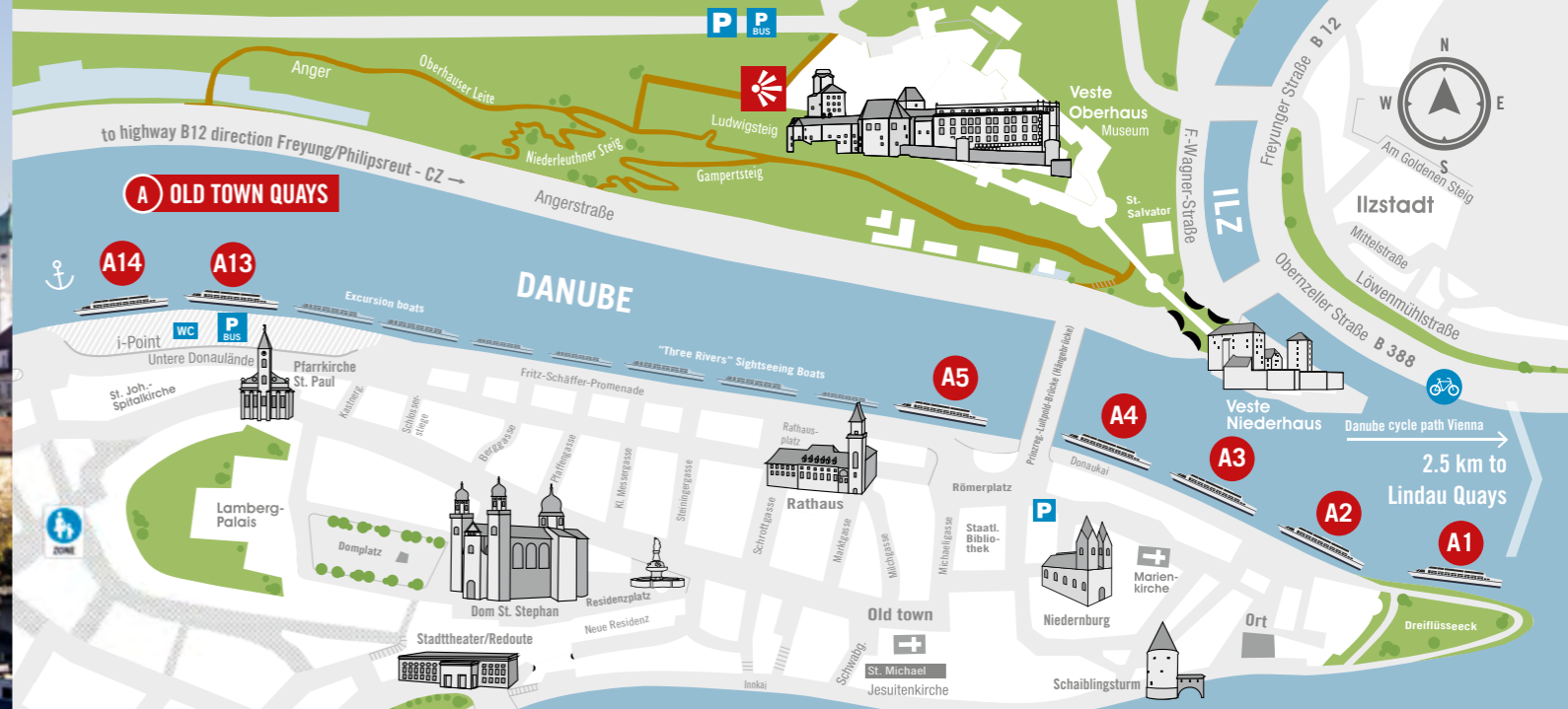

11 ST. PAUL'S CHURCH

The Baroque St. Paul's Church is situated to the northwest of St. Stephen's Cathedral, above the entrance to the pedestrian zone. It is the former parish church for Passau residents living in the Neumarkt quarter.

08 ST. STEPHEN'S CATHEDRAL

The cathedral is probably Passau's most famous sight and it is home to the world's largest cathedral organ, which consists of five individual organs with 17,974 organ pipes and 233 stops.

12 KASTELL BOIOTRO ROMAN MUSEUM

The Roman Museum is located directly next to the exposed foundations of the Late Roman fort "Kastell Boiotro", which visitors are able to view alongside a range of other exhibits.

TOP SIGHTS IN PASSAU.

Passau – the city on three rivers – can look back on an eventful history that has helped make it the vibrant city it is today. Various eras over the last millennium have influenced the city and its inhabitants in many different ways. This colorful history is clearly reflected in the wide range of sights to be seen around town.

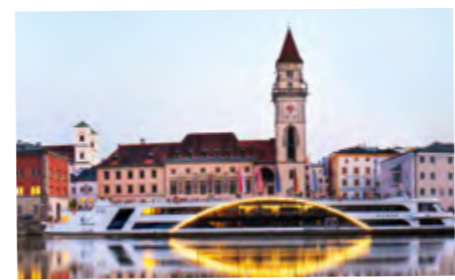


01 FORTRESS VESTE OBERHAUS / OBERHAUS MUSEUM

The fortress also offers a viewpoint and a viewing tower with a breathtaking panorama over the confluence of the three rivers and the city's picturesque Old Town.

02 THREE-RIVER-CONJUNCTION-POINT

The spot where the Danube, Inn and Ilz flow together is a unique natural spectacle. The Baroque townscape between the confluence and the city center is full of picturesque squares, winding alleys, romantic promenades and the soaring towers of churches and townhouses.



03 TOWN HALL AND FESTIVAL HALLS

The main hall was built in the 15th century. After the town fire in 1662, it was rebuilt in the Baroque style by the famous cathedral builders Lurago and Carlone. Outside, there is a remarkable large fresco on the north wall and fascinating high watermarks from historical floods painted on the Town Hall Tower.

04 NIEDERBURG CONVENT CHURCH

The convent was founded in around 730 AD. In the 12th century it became the economic basis for the principality of Passau together with its grounds. The tomb of the Blessed Gisela († 1065), the first Christian queen of Hungary, is located in its side aisle.

05 MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

The Museum of Modern Art is housed in one of the most beautiful historical buildings in the Old Town. The museum showcases international exhibitions of art from the 20th and 21st century.

06 HÖLLGASSE – THE ARTISTS' ALLEY

At the end of the last century, the Höllgasse became a popular hub for artists and craftspeople in the city. Today the street offers a fascinating mix of paintings, sculptures, jewelry and pottery – the perfect place to find something completely unique.

07 GLASS MUSEUM

This museum is situated in the "Hotel Wilder Mann" and houses 30,000 exhibits of Bohemian glass art (13,000 pieces displayed) spanning from the Baroque to the modern era.



09 NEW BISHOP'S RESIDENCE / DIOCESE MUSEUM AND CATHEDRAL TREASURY

The former palace of the Prince-Bishop from the 18th century today exhibits treasures from the eventful history of what was once the largest diocese in the Holy Roman Empire. The Rococo stairway, Diocese Museum and Cathedral Treasury as well as the Prince-Bishop's state rooms are all well worth seeing.

10 ST. NIKOLA CAMPUS CHURCH

The Romanesque crypt is still intact from the founding period, making it one of the oldest structures in Passau.



13 MARIAHILF PILGRIMAGE CHURCH

The Baroque Pilgrimage Church, which is still an important place of pilgrimage today, rises high above the city's Innstadt district. An enclosed pilgrimage staircase with 321 steps leads visitors and pilgrims up to the church. Mariahilf also boasts one of the most beautiful views over the so-called "Italian" side of Passau.

PASSAU CHRISTMAS MARKET

Here, the 700-year-old glass-blowing tradition is still very much alive and kicking. Visit the region's world-renowned glassworks and experience the artistic creation of this fragile material first hand.

DREIBURGENLAND

A popular destination for walking, cross-country skiing and leisure, this region combines tradition with a down-to-earth approach to life – both of which are perfectly underscored by the Bavarian Forest working museum village in Tittling.

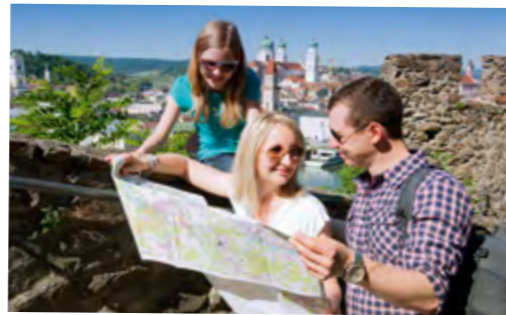

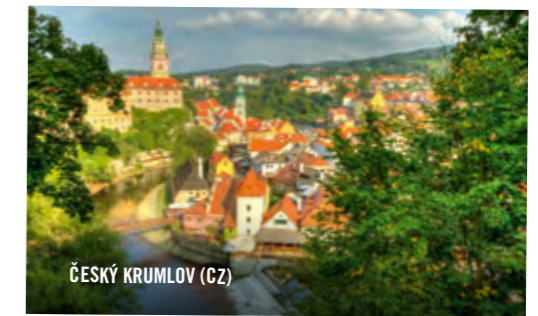
■ SALZBURG – HOME OF MOZART (A)

CITY TOURS, SIGHTSEEING CRUISES & BUILDING TOURS



■ BAROQUE GUIDED TOUR

All year round - minimum duration: 1.5 hours

Experience Passau's history first hand! This guided tour leads through the winding alleys of the romantic Old Town, directly past sights like the cathedral, bishop's residence and town hall.

■ INTRODUCTORY TOUR - PASSAU

Duration: 45 minutes

How do I find my way around the city? A brief tour of Passau. This tour is not intended to replace a guided tour of the city. It is only intended as an introduction to the city – the location of the cafés, restaurants, banks, photo opportunities etc.

■ PANORAMIC TOUR OF THE CITY

Duration: 1 1/2 hours – with your own bus or a rented bus

This tour offers a comprehensive insight into the cityscape and landscape of Passau as well as the best views over the Old Town from the fortress Veste Oberhaus and/or the Mariahilf pilgrimage church (destination to be agreed with the tour guide on the day in the case of fog, rain or snow).



■ BAROQUE CATHEDRAL TOUR (WITH HEADSETS)

Available all year during opening hours – Duration: Up to 1 hour

St. Stephen's Cathedral is an architectural masterpiece. The choir area and transept are Gothic, while the towers and nave are Baroque. Within the interior, architecture, stucco and paintings come together to create an overall Italian Baroque work of art. The incredible dimensions reflect the cathedral's former importance as the mother church for both the Danube region and Vienna's St. Stephen's Cathedral. Its organ is the largest cathedral organ in the world, offering an unparalleled sound experience thanks to its 17,974 organ pipes, 233 stops and five individual organs.

THEMED TOURS IN PASSAU



■ PASSAU FROM ITS ROYAL & IMPERIAL SIDE

Duration: 1 1/2 hours

Down the centuries, Passau has always been visited by many crowned heads in both war and peace. You will learn about the welcome and sometimes not-so-welcome royal and imperial visitors like Friedrich Barbarossa, Maria Theresia and Napoleon in this exciting and amusing tour.

■ COMBINED TOUR: PASSAU FROM ITS ROYAL & IMPERIAL SIDE WITH A VISIT TO THE GLASS MUSEUM

Duration: 2 hours

After a tour through the Old Town of Passau, you have the chance to take a closer look at royal and imperial implements and glass accessories. Passau's Glass Museum showcases a wide range of glass owned by kings, emperors, czars and popes, as well as glass pieces shown at the World Fairs of Paris and Chicago.

■ FOLLOWING IN EMPRESS SISSI'S FOOTSTEPS

Duration: 2 hours

Empress Sissi stayed in Passau three times: when she travelled to Vienna to get married, for a family meeting and once incognito. Follow in her footsteps and visit the Empress Sissi Room in the Hotel Wilder Mann.



■ PASSAU UNDER LIGHTS **C**

Mid Nov. – Mid Feb., starting at 04:00 p.m. – Duration: 1 1/2 hours

Experience an atmospheric torch-lit walk under the magical illuminations of the Old Town with mulled wine or punch during the pre-Christmas period. The tour starts in front of the Town Hall and then takes in the Höllgasse artists' alley, continues up to the square in front of the cathedral and the Christmas market, before concluding at the confluence of the rivers.

■ WINTER MAGIC **C**

Duration: 2 – 2 1/2 hours

Take a walk through the wintry Old Town to a traditional Passau confectioner. There, the master confectioner demonstrates the art of baking traditional German gingerbread. Guests can also enjoy home-made punch while tasting these culinary delights. Finally, each participant goes home with a small gift.

■ READY FOR A TREAT? **C**

Duration: 2 hours

As part of a delightful city tour, you can try your hand at confectionery and form a "Passauer Töpel" by hand using the finest marzipan. In the historical Heilig-Geist-Stiftschenke you can then try a glass of delicious "Stiftswein", another authentic speciality from the city.

Duration: 1.5 hours

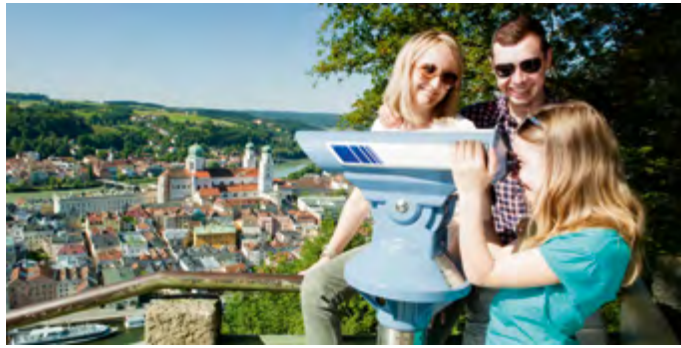

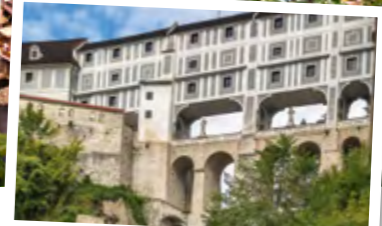

UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITE - ČESKÝ KRUMLOV (CZ)



■ BOHEMIAN FOREST TOUR TO ČESKÝ KRUMLOV (CZ)

Duration: All day The heart of Bohemia and the town of Český Krumlov, which has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1992, is always worth a visit. You can also use this opportunity to enjoy some Bohemian cuisine. Different combinations of departure and arrival locations are possible.

■ DANUBE VALLEY – GRANITE MUSEUM – MÜHLVIERTEL

Duration: All day The “Steinwelten” exhibition in the Granite Museum in the Bavarian Forest town of Hauzenberg provides a good insight into the history of granite mining. You will visit a traditional hand-weaving mill as well as the Schlägl Monastery in the Austrian Mühlviertel region for some refreshments and the “Stift Engelszell” where you can sample or buy herbal liquor.

■ BAVARIAN FOREST TOUR – CRYSTAL ROAD

Duration: All day Discover the untouched beauty of the Bavarian Forest, Central Europe’s largest forest landscape, as part of an excursion along the glass-making route in the Bavarian Forest National Park. A visit to a glassworks provides visitors with an insight into the handcrafts and techniques involved in glassmaking, many of which have been passed down for generations.

■ BAVARIAN CRUISE AND BAROQUE TOWN OF SCHÄRDING (A)

Duration: 4 hours, max. 50 people

Slowly drift through the incredible natural surroundings of the Inn valley by boat and immerse yourself in the Baroque art of the “Silberzeile” in the Austrian town of Schärding.

Duration: All day Burghausen, a former ducal residence town, is located on the banks of the Salzach a few kilometers before the river flows into the Inn. Burghausen’s castle features the longest fortification in Europe with a length of 1051 meters. The tour continues to Raitenhaslach with its Rococo church and Baroque monastery, pope chamber and its tavern. On the return journey, the tour makes a stop at the birth house of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI. in Markt.

■ DREIBURGENLAND

Bavarian Forest Working Museum Village – A journey back in time

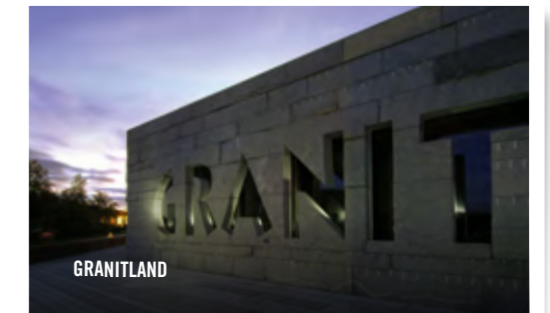
Duration: 4 hours, max. 50 people Traditional farm buildings dating from the 17th to the 19th century, market gardens and old breeds of pets provide an insight into the tough life previously faced by the people in the Bavarian Forest.
